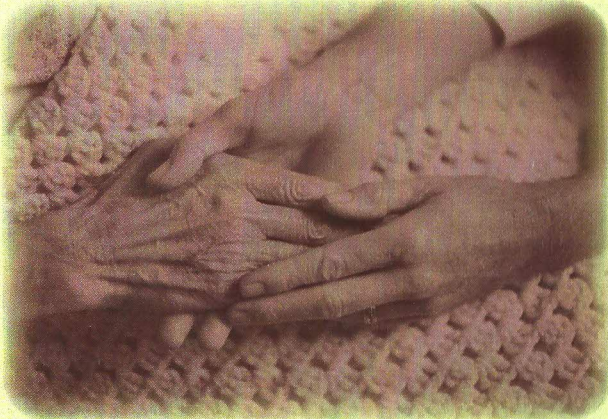

All Alachua County residents have access to medical care and affordable housing which sustains our vibrantly diverse and cohesive community.

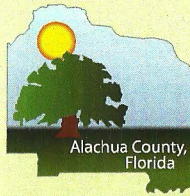

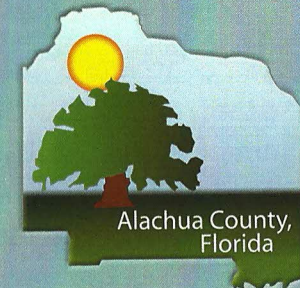

About Us

Alachua County Social Services (ACSS) is a County government agency established by the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners and funded through Alachua County property tax revenue.

ACSS serves eligible low income residents of Alachua County with medical or general assistance needs for which there are no Federal, State, or private programs available. Eligible residents must meet the Core Eligibility guidelines and fall within the established Federal Poverty Level.

ACSS is committed to helping individuals, either through the direct provision of our services or by referrals to other agencies. We support individuals in their efforts to achieve or return to self-sufficiency.

Applicant Must Provide

- Photo ID
- Birth Certificate
- Proof of U.S. Alachua County residency
- Proof of U.S. Citizenship or Permanent legal residency
- Proof of gross income for ALL household members for past 30 days
- Proof of current assets
- If no income, a support statement from family members or friends who have been providing you with help
- Status of any other public assistance you have applied for (WAGES, SSI/SSA, Unemployment, Worker's Compensation, Victim of Crimes)
- Status of any pending legal action
- Proof of health insurance status
- Other information as requested
